### **Email and SMS Templates for Flags and Kudos**

- When a faculty member raises a flag or kudos in Starfish, it is documented in two ways:
  - An email is sent to the student from the faculty member's pipeline email address:
  - The flag or kudos is posted on the student's Starfish homepage, where it can be viewed not only by the student but also by their primary academic counselor and other student support services faculty and staff.
- The auto-generated language that appears at the top of the email message, which you will not see, is minimal and given in memo format (see below).
- The bulk of the email message will appear in the comment box (when you raise a flag or kudos from your homepage in Starfish) or in the note box (when using the progress survey mode): **the language is entirely editable by you**.
